


#### Methodology

- Online survey of N=400 Oregonians ages 18+
- Conducted January 18–22, 2022 and includes benchmark data from previous surveys conducted in January 2017, 2018, 2019, and 2020
- Quotas and statistical weighting by gender, age, education, race, area of the state and political affiliation to match Oregon's general population
- Margin of error ±4.9%
- Due to rounding, some totals may differ by ±1 from the sum of separate responses


#### Confidence in the legal justice system

# Majorities have confidence in much of the legal justice system, especially when it comes to local police, but roughly 1 in 3 Oregonians lack confidence in the system.




#### Except when it comes to the FBI, there has been an erosion of confidence in legal justice institutions since 2017.






## When it comes to confidence in the U.S. Supreme Court, the the gap between Republicans and Democrats is now the widest it has been since 2017.



## Confidence in the FBI is higher among Democrats and higher income voters.




#### Confidence in the FBI began to diverge in 2017, with Democrats becoming more confident and Republicans less so.




# Even at the local level, where legal justice institutions more often reflect local political preferences, there has been an erosion of confidence in the legal justice system.




# Confidence in local police is higher among Republicans, higher income voters, white residents, men, and older Oregonians.



## The confidence of Oregonians in their local police departments has declined—especially after 2020.




## The confidence of Oregonians in their county district attorneys has also declined.
