Research purpose

This survey aims to check in with Oregon about some of the key policy debate that are happening during the 2021 legislative session.

It also asks Oregonians about COVID-19, vaccination distribution, and Governor Brown's order to restart in-person school.


And always, the survey updates benchmark questions about the direction of the state and impressions of key political leaders.

Methodology


- Online survey of N=600 Oregonians ages 18+
- Conducted March 7–14, 2021; 15 minutes to complete
- Quotas and statistical weighting by gender, age, education, race, area of the state and political affiliation to match Oregon's general population
- Margin of error ±4.0%
- Due to rounding, some totals may differ by ±1 from the sum of separate responses

Direction of the state: right direction Democrat / Republican / NAV/other







Impressions of Governor Kate Brown



Impressions of Governor Kate Brown





Impressions of President Joe Biden






Redistricting Partisan make-up of US House members

What do you think would be the most reasonable partisan makeup after the new district lines are drawn and elections held?





Worry about spread of COVID-19 in your community









Satisfaction with COVID-19 vaccine distribution in Oregon








Agree with Gov. Brown decision to prioritize teachers ahead of seniors for COVID-19 vaccination








Agree with Gov. Brown decision to require in-person instruction for elementary students by March 29








Agree with Gov. Brown decision to require in-person instruction for middle and high school students by April 19
