



Methodology

- Online survey of N=500 Oregonians ages 18+
- Conducted August 31–September 5, 2021
- Quotas and statistical weighting by gender, age, education, race, area of the state and political affiliation to match Oregon's general population
- Margin of error ±4.4%
- Due to rounding, some totals may differ by ±1 from the sum of separate responses


Do you think Oregon is headed in the right direction or is it on the wrong track?






Direction of the state since COVID-19

Right direction / Wrong track / Don't know




Right direction sentiment by party since COVID-19











Worry about personal financial situation



Pre-COVID-19 / Since COVID-19







Impressions of Governor Brown




Impressions of Governor Kate Brown




Impressions of President Biden




Positive by party




Impressions of organizations and places




Positive impressions of the Portland & Oregon's rural communities




Which party Oregonians trust more on issues

Democratic Party issue trust advantage








Younger Oregonians are much less positive about America and its place in the world




