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INTRODUCTION & METHODOLOGY

From January 18-22, 2022, DHM Research conducted a survey of Oregonians. The purpose of the survey was to track Oregonians' opinions about the economy, Covid-19, and the criminal justice system. The survey also asked Oregonians about issues in the upcoming gubernatorial elections, controversies related to critical race theory, and healthcare.

<u>Research Methodology:</u> The online survey consisted of 400 Oregon residents ages 18+ and took approximately 15 minutes to complete. This is a sufficient sample size to assess Oregonians' opinions generally and to review findings by multiple subgroups.

Respondents were contacted by using a professionally maintained online panel. A variety of quality control measures were employed, including questionnaire pre-testing, data validation, and real time monitoring of responses. To ensure a representative sample, demographic quotas were set, and data was weighted by area of state, age, gender, race, education, and political party affiliation.

<u>Statement of Limitations:</u> Any sampling of opinions or attitudes is subject to a margin of error. The margin of error is a standard statistical calculation that represents differences between the sample and total population at a confidence interval, or probability, calculated to be 95%. This means that there is a 95% probability that the sample taken for this study would fall within the stated margin of error if compared with the results achieved from surveying the entire population. The margin of error for this survey is ±4.9%.
