Research sponsors

The research was completed as a community service by DHM Research in partnership with the Oregon Values and Beliefs Center. Both organizations are independent and non-partisan. DHM Research is a Certified B Corporation and OVBC is an Oregon charitable nonprofit corporation.

Research purpose

To assess Oregonians' expectations about when it will be safe to participate in normal activities (e.g., get a haircut) and the criteria they will use to determine safety.

- This is the second of three data releases for this survey. Topics for the other data releases:
 - Data release 1: Oregonians' support for the state's stay at home orders.
 - Data release 3: Oregonians' opinions and experiences of the healthcare system, and their support for releasing people from prisons and jails to manage COVID-19.

Methodology


- Online survey of N=900 Oregonians ages 18+
- Conducted April 17–21, 2020; 15 minutes to complete
- Quotas and statistical weighting by gender, age, education, race, area of the state and political affiliation to match Oregon's general population
- Margin of error ±3.3% for full sample; ±4.6 to ± 4.7% for split sampled questions (N=436-464)
- Due to rounding, some totals may differ by ±1 from the sum of separate responses

TRUST & REPORTING


Oregonians put their greatest trust public health agencies when making decisions about when it is safe to reopen.

Very high / High / Medium / Low / None / Don't know




There are large partisan differences in trust levels for Governor Brown and President Trump.



Oregonians support reporting COVID-19 cases at multiple levels.


Would you support or oppose the State of Oregon reporting the number of people who test positive for COVID-19 by_____



SAFE TO RETURN TO ACTIVITIES


Oregonians expect it to take months before it will be safe to return to normal activities.

The availability of widespread testing, effective treatments, and low infection rates will be most important for Oregonians deciding when to return to normal activities.






PLANS TO SELF-ISOLATE IF IN CONTACT WITH COVID-19 POSITIVE PERSON


Many Oregonians do not plan to immediately self-isolate if they learn they have been in contact with a COVID-19 positive person.
